1. Member check-in and reconnect.
2. Shelly Bailey led a discussion on potential plans for unification of arts, and how to handle online interaction with students during this time. Flipgrid is being entertained as a possibility to create online classrooms. Andy Meadows is coordinating with members of the state in order to figure out how connect with our students during this time. Google Drive will be utilized to copy and drop links, files, etc. in order to distribute to our students. Members should plan to start sharing documents for students using these digital resources. There are areas within our state that do not have online access. Plan to create a statewide “drop box” for students to access these resources. Tricia has created a parent, student, and teacher folder in our Google Drive. All members have editing permission. James Rowling of NAEA is looking for all arts teachers to submit online lessons such as YouTube, voice recordings, etc. Kaci Norman is coordinating with art museums throughout the state in an attempt to compile student artwork created during this time for a potential fall student art show.

3. Talks of putting the YAM flag up on social media and potentially hanging at our state conference in the fall as well.
4. Tricia Oliver is opening the position for News Media / Social Media Chair. Abby Kuhn is stepping down for personal reasons and we need a replacement.

Dr. Terrance Brown introduced the idea that school systems will end grading for the 2019-2020 school year at the conclusion of the third nine weeks grading period, which would present pitfalls and problems for students who are struggling with current grades. Please use caution and check with your IT Dept. before introducing students to potentially harmful apps, software, videos, etc. There is a struggle currently between what is new content versus enrichment. Keep that in mind when introducing new material to our students. Wait to discuss portfolios with AP students until your district has cleared your building for possible reentry. Districts across the state are working with college boards to combat this situation.
6. Amanda Youngblood will be sending information out on April 1st for the upcoming fall conference. Be on the lookout for information regarding this. May 1st is the potential enrollment date for the conference.
